Journeys and Exile in Roberto Bolaño's Novel The Savage Detectives

The Chilean writer Roberto Bolaño (1953-2003) is one of the most important representatives of Latin American literature of the last century. His novel *The Savage Detectives* (1998) represents a profound meditation on the meanings of journey, exile, initiation and quest, the author following some great writers of the past (from Homer and Virgil to James Joyce) and finding new and original ways to express his ideas. His characters, mainly intellectuals, are restless travelers or wanderers; they lose and subsequently find themselves in order to discover a deeper meaning of the world around. In his novel *The Savage Detectives* (1998), the Chilean writer Roberto Bolaño approaches the great literary theme of the journey, with the purpose of expressing the fundamental nature of his characters, but also of the world these characters inhabit. Bolano's creations have often been
